

Dandan Zhang is a professor of economics and deputy dean at the National School of Development, Peking University. She holds titles such as Boya Young Scholar of Peking University and Youth Cheung-Kong Scholar. Zhang also serves as an executive director of the China Labor Economics Association and chairs the Special Committee on Artificial Intelligence and Flexible Employment.

Earning her Ph.D. in Economics from the Australian National University, Zhang's research focuses on labor economics and the Chinese Economy. She is particularly interested in the welfare of vulnerable groups during transition periods, the impact of social and institutional changes on human behavior, and new labor market phenomena such as artificial intelligence and flexible employment.

Her work has been featured in leading journals, including the *Economic Journal*, *Nature: Human Behaviour*, and the *Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization*. She has led projects funded by the National Natural Science Foundation and the National Social Science Fund of China. She has provided policy advice to key government agencies, influencing employment and public health policies.
